
The various gradings of stamps are, in order; superb, extremely fine, very fine, fine. In the case of sets, large blocks, sheets, etc., the condition quoted represents the average, and quality above and below this standard can be expected.

Mixed Condition: In large lots, the condition is generally expected to range from fair to at best fine. Serious defects can be expected.

**Handstamp on reverse**: Denotes either a dealer, collector or indecipherable expert's mark.

Signed by: Denotes either the actual signature or mark of the expertiser. The absence of mentioning a signature does not reflect on the ability or knowledge of the party involved

Shaded portion can represent an actual hinge or the area disturbed by a hinge.

n.h. = Never Hinged – unused with original gum in Post Office state and unmounted.

> = Lightly Hinged - unused with full original gum showing some evidence of a previous hinge which may be present in part or

entirely removed.

= Original Gum - unused with original gum somewhat disturbed o.g by previous hinging which may still be present.

part o.g. = Part Original Gum - unused with original gum, large hinge remnants may or may not be present.

disturbed o.g. = Disturbed Original Gum - unused with original gum affected by sweating, glazing or mount disturbance; may not resemble the original gum.

unused = Unused without gum.

Ungummed = Unused without gum, as issued.




#### Cranston Holman


1907 - 1993

Harmers International is honored to offer the collection of Dr. Cranston Holman. Dr. Holman was a Tennis player who embarked upon a second career as a world-renowned thoracic surgeon and was one of the pioneers of heart-lung transplants. In the 1920's Cranson Holman supplemented his studies at Stanford University by playing tennis. In 1925 he was ranked U.S. number 8 singles player by United States Lawn Tennis Association (predecessor to USTA). He was the first West Coast player to win the National Junior Championship. In 1930 he won his final title at the Mid-Pacific Championships in Hawaii beating Jiro Sato and decided to retire from Tennis to focus on his medical career.

He served his country with distinction in the Pacific during World War II as a surgeon; receiving a Bronze Star for his tireless work. After the War, he affiliated with New York Hospital and Cornell University Medical College, where he remained until his retirement in 1975. On December 25, 1969, Dr. Holman became part of medical history when he and Dr. C. Walton Lillebel led a team of twelve doctors who performed the first heart and lung transplant. This procedure has saved over 70,000 lives.

Dr Holman was an avid worldwide collector and enjoyed relationships with many notable dealers and collectors, including the Russian-born American author and philosopher Ayn Rand (noted for her novel Fountainhead). Parts of Ms. Rand's material entered Dr. Holman's Collection. Harmers International will be offering his material here and in our next sale.

Henry Dearborn served as the Secretary of War under Thomas Jefferson and was a commanding general in the War of 1812. Fort Dearborn was named in his honor. Quite ironically, the letter is written to Captain William Linnard who was elected as the President of the Carpenter's Company. Dearborn's letter informs Linnard that officers are not allowed any more furniture than an regular soldier.

#### CONDITIONS OF SALE

#### THE PLACING OF A BID SHALL CONSTITUTE ACCEPTANCE OF THE CONDITIONS OF SALE

#### **BIDDING**

- 1. Unless announced otherwise by the auctioneer, all bids are per lot, as numbered in the printed catalogue applicable to such auction (the "Catalogue"). Harmers International, Inc. (hereinafter "Harmers"), as agent for the consignor or vendor, shall regulate the bidding and shall determine the manner in which the bidding shall be constructed. Harmers reserves the right to withdraw any lot prior to the commencement of bidding (without liability to any potential purchaser or agent), to re-offer any withdrawn lot, to divide a lot and to group two or more lots belonging to the same consignor or vendor. Harmers has the right to refuse any bid believed not made in good faith, demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration, or demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder for any reason whatsoever.
